The INC provides an opportunity for law students to practice and improve their negotiation skills through carefully structured simulations – particularly for students who aspire to be international lawyers. This year, students from 38 internationally renowned universities from 11 countries took part, including those from the UK, Australia, Germany, Indonesia, Japan, Kenya, Poland and Singapore.

In a closely contested final round between Macquarie University and the University of Oxford, the University of Oxford emerged overall winner. The expert panel of judges for the final round comprised of [Chris Parsons](#) (Chairman of Herbert Smith Freehills' India Practice), Manjaree Chowdhary (Executive Director and General Counsel, Maruti Suzuki India), Rakesh Prusti (General Counsel, OYO) and Meera Singh (General Counsel, KPMG India).
